Dear Dr. Gallaudet

It has been on my mind for some time to write you to ask what are the fees &c for tuition at Gallaudet College. I have a deaf teacher, at 21, a very intelligent chap, who is anxious to get a more extended culture than we have been able to give him. He is a friend of the <sup>Mr</sup> Candler, but of distinctly superior type, though unfortunately not so well blessed with this world's gear. If the fees are not too large I thought of trying to get a scholarship for him from some of our educational authorities to enable me to send him to you. I should be glad if at the same time you could furnish me with a set of old entrance examination questions that I might coach him up to standard.

We are contemplating a Conference under the auspices of the N.A.T.D. in Edinburgh next year end of July 1907. Would you be able to attend do you think, & give us a paper on American Education of the Deaf

& some account of Fallandet College?  
we want a move on in Scotland in D & D  
work, and we are anxious to make our Conference  
an international one - with the hope that if we  
can make known what is being done for the  
deaf in other countries, our authorities here  
might be spurred up to do a little more for us  
than they do at present.

I trust you are still going strong at  
Washington, and that you & yours are all  
well. I noticed that you were over in Europe  
at the Hill Festival





Dear Dr. Gallaudet

Yours of June 16<sup>th</sup> containing intimation of Mr Innes failure to pass the Entrance Exam: to Gallaudet just to hand. I am disappointed at the result - as he seemed to answer the papers readily & seemed pretty confident of the result. I did not check his answers myself. However it cannot be helped & we must make the best of it. If you will take him into Kendal for £30 & prepare him for the College, I will send him on in Sept. - as I wish him not to delay going forward. I have got up a public Subscription to send him, and have raised £120 up to the present and am hopeful of getting enough to send him to you for 3 years, calculating at the rate of £50 per ann. (£30 for fees + 20 for travelling & pocket expenses). So will you let me know if this will do, & what date he should be at Washington.

Thanks for the Sample Questions. I will deal with them either in the messenger or Teacher of the Deaf at the earliest opportunity. I am hoping however to be able to pay a visit to your Schools during the coming winter. I am hearing so much from Dr. Dove of what is done over there that I feel it to be very desirable to come & see for myself. So I am going to try & make an effort.
