I have the honor

with the requirements of a pro-
vision of an Act making appropriations
for sundry civil expenses of the govern-
ment for the fiscal year ending Dec
30. 1843, and for other purposes (see pp.
15 & 16 of said act) approved Dec 10. 1842;

I would respectfully request
that these deeds be submitted
to the Attorney General, as required
in the Act above alluded to,
and that on his approval of
them, a warrant, or requisition
on the Treasury be issued to
Messrs Wm Stickney and Robert
C. Fox Executors, for the sum
of Seventy Thousand Dollars,

the payment of which is also pro-
vided for in the act above
referred to.

Hon. Columbus Deland,
Secretary of the Interior,
Sir:—

I have been
authorized and directed by the
Board of Directors of this insti-
tution, to call the attention of
Congress to a matter set forth
on page fourteen of our last
Annual Report, a copy of which
is herewith enclosed.

In accordance with the
requirements of an act of Congress
approved June 10. 1872, deeds of

conveyance, approved by the Attorney General have been executed and delivered, making over to the United States the title to all the real estate owned by the institution; and upon this property no encumbrance remains.

The indebtedness of \$10,697⁴⁶/₁₀₀, referred to in our report, is to the fund for Current Expenses, and has been carried for two years.

In the opinion of our Board of Directors it is proper that an estimate for an appropriation should be submitted to Congress, to provide for this deficiency.

As it is important that the sum involved should be re-

turned to the Current Expense
fund before the end of the present
fiscal year, I would respectfully
ask that the enclosed item be
transmitted as an estimate, to
the Hon. Chairman of the
House Committee on Appropriations,
with the request that it be in-
serted in the deficiency bill
now pending before the Committee.
