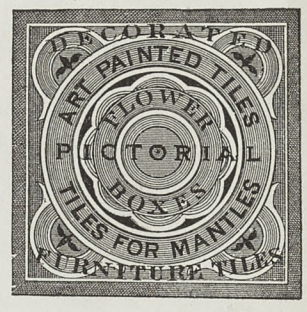
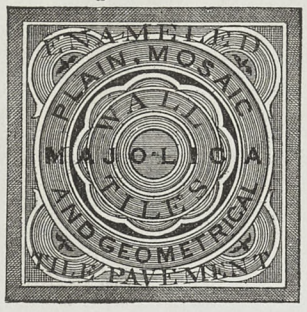

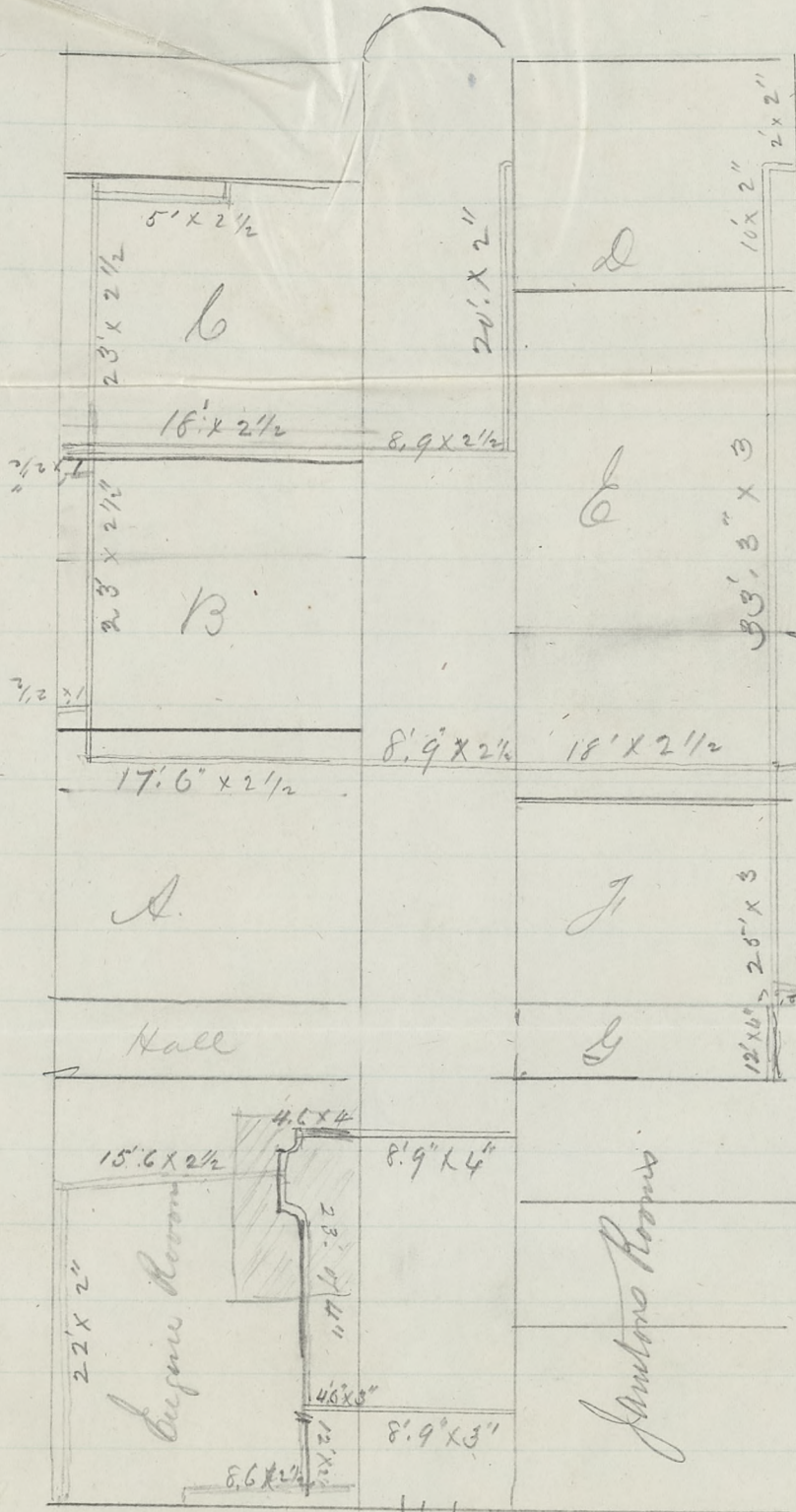

E P Kellogg reports the Floors in your Building finished when he left, with the exception of a few Tiles which have since been sent and which Mr French was to put in.

The writer had hoped to visit the Building last week, but could not get off, and a summons for Jury duty effectually stops him for the present — It is not necessary for us to inspect the work, as Mr Kellogg knows our wishes and finishes his work well — You will see that we have added to our bill \$30, the cost of laying a part of one of the Corridors a second time, and which we understand you will require the Contractor to pay — This is the cost of the work, and we should be repaid, but if the settlement of it with the Contractor will give you trouble we will waive it.

We enclose our bill for the Floors, amount \$2322.18, and two for some Wall Tiles, amt \$12.10 — If you can conveniently do so, we shall be obliged by your arranging

about the middle
or last of next week when we have
large payments to make. — You have
a charge against us for Freight and
Cartage which should, of course, be
