Dear Sir:-

According to verbal understanding our Mr. Fischer had with you when in Washington some days ago, we beg to submit the following proposition. We will agree to furnish one of our #21 vertical Otto gas engines of the latest improved pattern fitted with an electric igniter having 3 actual H. P., together with one #3 vertical air compressor of approved type, having tight and loose pulleys of proper size so that you can belt from them direct to engine without a counter shaft and having 3" cylinder by a 6" stroke. Will also furnish two #4 air receivers made of galvanized iron well riveted and tested to stand 100 lbs. pressure, 20" in diameter by 5' high fitted with safety valves, pressure gauges and a drip cock all of which we will agree to ~~supply~~ furnish f. o. b. cars Phila. for the sum of four hundred sixty-seven dollars (\$467.00) net cash. We will agree to erect the engine and compressor you to furnish foundation for both ^{with} including the piping of engine and connecting of gas, water and drain ^{with} pipes within 15' of the engine; also connect the two air receivers with air compressor and air pipe directly over the compressor for the net sum of \$100.00. This includes also a belt to connect the engine with the compressor directly.

We mail you herewith blue print showing the lay out of the plant. You will note that we have arranged to place the tanks on the floor instead of hanging them to ceiling which we think will be more desirable. If however you wish them to hang to the ceiling we will make no extra charge.

You request us to make a quotation on a small counter shaft which you wish to use for other purposes. We will furnish a 1 5/16" shaft 8' long together with three hangers and put same put fastening to ceiling in proper form for the net sum of \$12.00 extra. This price does not include pulleys as we do not know exactly what you want.
