EUREK RECEIVES CONFERENCE HONORS

Bison quarterback, Ken Eurek, recently received an honorable mention on the 1971 Mason-Dixon Conference All-Star football team. Ken, a junior physical education major from Arcadia, Nebraska, passed for 1021 yards in eight games, completing 92 out of 208 attempts for a 44.2 percentage. This marks the first time a Gallaudet quarterback has broken the 1000 yard mark passing.

1904-1906 STUDENT RETURNS FOR A VISIT Earl Elder, a farmer from Muscatine, Iowa, made his first trip back to Gallaudet on December 22, 1971 since leaving in 1906. Accompanied by his wife, who also attended Gallaudet for a year, and his granddaughter, who lives in Prince Georges County, Mr. Elder brought with him a scrap book which he compiled during his student days.

Mr. Elder, who became deaf at nine months as a result of scarlet fever, attended the Iowa School for the Deaf in Council Bluffs, Iowa, before entering Gallaudet. Active in sports all of his life, Mr. Elder has won the Iowa State Championship and numerous bowling trophies. He also proudly told us that he is the oldest member of the Men's Bowling Association in Muscatine and is still playing horseshoes.

After reminiscing with Wallace Eddington, a graduate of the Class of 1915, he and his family left with Mr. Edington for a brief tour of the campus and lunch.
