2. "Put me in mind of, and with the rest of the money" is modified by this clause.
3. (a) "I" is in the nominative case, being the subject of was. ~~to~~
- (b) I is in the nominative case, being the predicate of to.
- (c) Me is in the objective case, being the object of a verb told.
- (d) "Me" is in the objective case, being the object of a preposition at.
4. "directly to a shop" is modified by the verb went.
- "me in mind of what good things I might have bought with the rest of the money" is modified by the verb put.
- "at me so much for my folly" is modified by the verb laughed.

5(a) "Whistling all over the house" is modified by the noun (a whistle).

"Disturbing ~~all over~~ the family" is modified by the noun whistle.

"Understanding the bargain" is modified by the nouns brothers, sisters and cousins
