Disability Rights Advocates for Technology is fighting this ruling in Florida.

The government, while saying it supports the deaf, has not mentioned anything about helping the deaf while outlining its ambitious plans to help other disabled groups.

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DeafHistory - Looking Back:

Year 1999 - after a run of nearly 20 years, the AMRAD, an organization of radio and electronics hobbyists based in Northern Virginia, but serving the Washington, DC area, unplugs the HEX BBS.

HEX BBS was a primitive e-mail service that served a small number of users in the Washington, DC area - for years - before the Internet became wildly popular.

This project was funded by Department of Education, and intended to provide email service for the Washington, DC deaf and disabled community. After the funding stopped, AMRAD continued operating it for years!

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Deaf and the Money:

\$3,000 - raised by the national Deaf Baseball Team of Cuba, by selling boxes of cigars at the 2000 World Deaf Baseball Championships that took place in Washington, DC.

The Cuban players needed hard cash to bring home hard-to-get consumer goods and which was why they, on the sly, sold these illegal Havana cigar boxes. Needless to say, these boxes sold like hot pancakes!

The World Deaf Baseball Championships is no longer being staged. Logistical and monetary issues prevented staging of future international deaf baseball classics.
