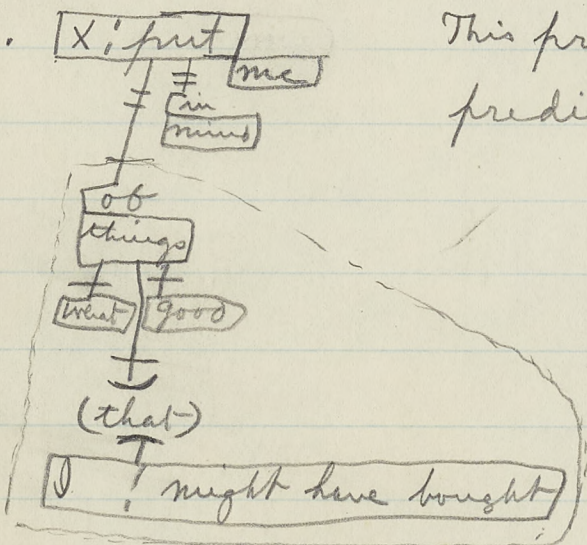

- 1. (a) The predicate verb "filled" is modified by the adverbial clause "when I was a child of 7 yrs old".
- (b) The noun "shop" is modified by the conjunctive adverbial clause "where they sold toys for children".
- (c) The predicate verb "had given" is modified by the conjunctive adverbial clause, "as it was worth".

2. This prep-adverbial clause modifies the predicate verb "put"



- 3. (a) "friends": in the nom. case, subject of the verb "filled"
- (b) "I", pronoun in the nom. case, predicate nom. "child"
- (c) "Toys" noun in the obj case, object of the verb "sold"
- (d) "rest" of the money "noun" in the obj case, object of the prep. "with"

- 4. "On a holiday" is an adverbial phrase, modifying the predicate verb "filled".
- "Whistling all over the house" is an adverbial phrase, modifying the verb "went".
- "So much" is an adverbial phrase, modifying the verb "laughed".

- 5. "Being charmed" is a participial phrase, modifying the pronoun "I"
- "Much pleased" is a participial phrase modifying the pronoun "I"

"Understanding the bargain" is a participial phrase modifying the nouns "bro", "sister" and "cousins".

(a) "Understanding" is a participle that governs an object = "bargain"

6. "It" stands for the "whistle"

7. (a) Mr. McKinley, the President, may be re-elected soon.

(b) It looks as if it is going to rain.

(c) He shook his head, shuddered his shoulder and <sup>he</sup> cast up his eyes.
