BIBLIOGRAPHY OF CHILDREN'S BOOKS

A new book, Bibliography of Reading
for Deaf Children, whose principal
compiler was Goldie Trboyevich, has
recently been published by the Media
Services and Captioned Films Branch of
the Bureau of Education for the Handi-
capped, Office of Education. Goldie
is director of Media Services at
Kendall School.

The book contains a list of titles
and brief content summaries for some
600 books suitable for deaf children
from kindergarten through grade 12.
Each election is also designated as
Primary, Intermediate, or Advanced.

At the present time, 11,000 copies
of the books have been printed; and
the book will be available at the
Gallaudet Bookstore in the near
future.
