AUDIOLOGY AND SPEECH OFFERING NEW COURSES

Two experimental and three new courses will be offered for the first time this spring semester by the Department of Audiology and Speech.

- 1. Seminar in Audiology and Speech
- A. Manuscript Reading for TV-an experimental study of the principles of presenting other people's ideas and words through the medium of simultaneous communication on TV.
- B. A Study of Sign Language—an experimental study of American Sign Language starting with non-verbal communication and tracing the history of signs, sign language systems in other cultures, and problems with literary translation into English. The students will also be introduced to "baby sign formations" and conduct a class project involving the collection of dialect differences in ASL.
- 2. <u>Parliamentary Procedure</u>-rules of parliamentary procedure and their correct application to the management of campus and other organizations.
- 3. <u>Group Discussion</u>-process of thinking and problem solving in committees and small groups; methods of leading and

participating in discussions and conferences.

4. Argumentation and Debate-the process of arriving at reasons and conclusions; practice in debate; projects in analysis, research, ordering of arguments and refutation.
