

GEORGE ALLEN FUND ESTABLISHED

George Allen, coach and general manager of the Washington Redskins, has established a scholarship fund for Gallaudet College students.

The scholarship recipients will be selected at the beginning of each academic year. The students to be chosen will preferably be athletes, who have played on a varsity team for one year, and have good academic records and can demonstrate financial need. Both males and females are eligible.

Mr. Allen, who became interested in Gallaudet College as a result of his participation in the Gallaudet Forum, will officially announce the scholarship fund to the College on June 12. A press conference will follow a breakfast given by the College in Mr. Allen's honor.

MSSD CONSTRUCTION TO BEGIN

A construction contract for the

building of the permanent facilities for MSSD has been awarded to the American Construction Co.

The 13 million dollar contract will allow construction of the acadmic complex, physical education facilities, dining hall, an infirmary, and kitchen. The infirmary and kitchen will be shared by MSSD and the College.

Although the formal groundbreaking is not scheduled until the fall, preliminary construction will begin immediately. It is hoped that the complex, which will serve 600 students, will be completed by the fall of 1975.

SIGNS FOR SUMMER

An eight-week summer sign language program will be offered for the first time beginning on June 18.

Courses will include: (1) Basic Manual Communication, (2) Conversational Sign Language I (Intermediate I), (3) Conversational Sign Language II (Intermediate II), (4) Conversational Sign Language III (Advanced), and (5) Introduction to Interpreting.
