To get to the studio, take I-95 South to the Shirlington exit. People are requested to arrive one-half hour before the program starts.

The program is about cancer and is from "The Killers" series. Deaf and hard of hearing people are needed to attend. Your evaluations and reactions to the captioning will be used in developing the caption decoding device for home TV use.

SIGN LANGUAGE CONFERENCE TO BE HELD

The Linguistics Research Laboratory and the Sign Language Programs are sponsoring their first annual Sign Language Conference on Saturday, April 27, at Gallaudet College.

The conference will attempt to examine sign language from the perspectives of educators, interpreters, sociologists, psychologists and linguists and to examine the many different kinds of signing now in use.

In developing the theme of the conference "American Sign Language and English: What Lies In Between," some of the following topics have been proposed for discussion: issues in language and culture; adolescent signing; "verbal," "non-verbal," and "low verbal;" teacher training programs and standardization and the effects of using a stigmatized language.
