#### GETTING TO KNOW THE DEPARTMENT OF COUNSELING

The Department of Counseling was established for the purpose of training school guidance counselors to work with deaf children. Its program is unique as it is the only one in the nation which specifically trains counselors to work with deaf children and their parents in an educational setting.

It is also serving as an "in-service training program" for many staff and faculty members from MSSD, Kendall and the College as well as for many vocational rehabilitation counselors working for the state of Maryland.

The Counselor Training Program emphasizes practicum experience in schools, vocational rehabilitation offices and specialized training centers. During the spring of 1974 there were 15 trainees doing their internships. The department offers a two year graduate school program leading to a M.A. degree.

Faculty and staff can assist the department in several ways. Each deaf person on campus is a valuable resource in aiding graduate students learn about deafness and deaf people. Deaf people on campus can help the graduate students develop their receptive skills by conversing in sign language. In addition, it would be helpful if the students could be invited to social activities in the deaf community, taken home to a meal and conversation and any other type of function which will expose the trainees to the many facets of life within the deaf community.

The Department is staffed by three full-time instructors and several part-time teachers and it is located in the Counseling Center.
