COLTS/REDSKINS GAME TO BE SIGNED

For the first time in the history of televised sporting events, deaf viewers will have the play by play calls of the Baltimore Colts/Washington Redskins pre-season game interpreted in sign language during the telecast on WMAL-TV, Channel 7, September 12, at 11:30 p.m.

The Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf, Inc. through its Potomac Chapter is providing certified interpreters for this telecast. Mike Denninger and Dennis Cokely will sign the play by play commentary.

This unprecedented move by WMAL-TV was prompted by a letter from a deaf viewer commenting how deaf people can see all the action but have to read the next morning's paper for the score and details.
