## WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Our Placement Office has recently released employement statistics for Gallaudet's 1975 graduating class. In today's tough labor market -- one that is particularily difficult for recent college graduates -- it is heartening to know that at least 74% of last year's graduating seniors have found employment or graduate school placements.

Of the remaining 26%, it is not known what the majority of these former students are doing as they did not use the placement services or could not be located. As of several weeks ago, there were only 13 students who were still negotiating for positions.

### HOMECOMING WRAP-UP

It was an almost perfect day all around with clear skies and victories for all of Gallaudet's teams.

The day's events opened with Gallaudet tying the Toronto Silents 3-3 in soccer. Patricia Hall, who was crowned Homecoming queen at Friday evening's pep rally, led the colorful parade.

Victorious for the second consecutive week, the Bisons beat Virginia Commonwealth University by six points. The score was 12-6. Jeff Bartholmew, who played both soccer and football, kicked a 37 yard field goal -- really fine for college ball.
