CONFERENCE HAVING DIFFICULTIES

The White House Conference on Handicapped Individuals which is planned for December is already running into difficulties. According to Jack Smith, executive director of the conference, too little money, too little lead time and too many conflicts during the Bicentennial year will keep the conference from generating the kind of public awareness about handicapped individuals that was hoped for.

The conference is to focus attention on the employment, social, and health problems that handicapping conditions create for some 75 million Americans. Legislation has been introduced in Congress to postpone the conference to 1977. House action on the Senate-passed bill is expected this month.
