AN INTERESTING QUOTE

"... Take those who are born deaf, who have no knowledge of language; I hold that the basis of their education should be written language; the language of the people. The spoken language presented by word of mouth, what we term speech reading in America, reading from the mouth, every child who has a knowledge of language can acquire; but I think that with the congenitally deaf to commence their education by speech reading, to commence to have the child read words from the mouth, before he knows the language, interferes with his mental development, retards progress in the acquisition of language, and thus defeats its own ends, and retards the acquisition of speech reading itself."
