PROGRAM FOR LEGAL INTERPRETERS

Gallaudet, in cooperation with the Center for the Administration of Justice at Wayne State University, will offer a three-week intensive training program for legal interpreters. At the conclusion of the program, all participants will take a legal evaluation conducted by the RID and, if successful, will be awarded a Legal Specialist Certificate.

The sessions held at Gallaudet will be administered by the Office of Sign Language Programs and will be held from June 6-26.
