THG'S TRAVEL SCHEDULE

The College's statue of Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet and Alice will be part of a bicentennial exhibition of the works of Daniel Chester French which will tour four major American cities, including Washington, D.C., beginning in October. The exhibition is being sponsored by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

The National Trust will clean and restore the statue on the campus before it leaves for its gala tour. The exhibition schedule is as follows:

SUMMER CHILD CARE CENTER

The Summer Programs Office will sponsor a Child Care Center for all children ages three to 13 of Gallaudet faculty, staff and students. The Center will operate from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays through Fridays, June 1 to August 20.

Field trips, organized games, learning activities, sign language instruction and arts and crafts will be part of the program. The cost will be \$20 per week for children of faculty and staff grades GS 7 and above and \$15 per week for children of students and staff below GS 7. In addition to the Child Care Center, the P.E. Department's Recreation Program will be offered again this summer. The Rec Program will be open to children ages five to 12 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. from June 21 through July 23. The cost is \$10 per child. If your child is also in the Child Care Center, the staff will deliver him or her to the gym at 8:30 a.m. and pick him or her up at 11:30 a.m.
