INCENTIVE FOR REMOVING BARRIERS

The Senate Finance Committee recently voted to include in the Tax Reform Bill an incentive for the removal of architectural and transportation barriers.

Known as the Dole-Mondale Compromise, the provision allows taxpayers to claim a deduction of up to \$25,000 for costs incurred in the removal of architectural and transportation barriers. The deduction is subject to renewal within three years. If approved by the Senate, the bill goes to a joint conference of the House and the Senate.
