EMERGENCY MESSAGES ON T.V. CAPTIONED

The Federal Communication Commission has amended its rules to require television stations to transmit all emergency notifications visually as well as aurally so persons with impaired hearing may be made aware of emergency situations. This action becomes effective February 1, 1977.

The National Center for Law and the Deaf has scheduled a press conference for formal announcement of this action. The press conference will be held Friday, September 17, at 10 a.m. in the Dirksen Senate Office Building.
