OUR STATUE IS LEAVING

The Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet and Alice Cogswell statue which graces the front of the Gallaudet campus will be leaving the end of October. It is due to be shipped by Oct. 27th and will join the exhibit of the works of Daniel Chester French which is due to open at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City on Nov. 3.

The Gallaudet College Alumni Association Board of Directors has authorized Dr. Merrill to have the statue cleaned before it leaves the campus. The cleaning process, which will remove the stains and

corrosion of the years, will return the statue to its original brown color. The cleaning process will probably begin next week.
