FCC TO ADD TV-PHONE

On Wednesday afternoon, Dec. 15 a new TV-Phone (compatible with a TTY) will be installed at the offices of the Federal Communication Commission. Glen Goldberg from the National Center on Law and the Deaf which was instrumental in encouraging the FCC to add this service will be on hand for the installation.

This new service will make it possible for deaf persons to communicate directly with the FCC on such matters as Closed Captioning of television programs.

MORE RESULTS FROM "60 MINUTES"

Letters are now coming in from the general public requesting information about programs and activities of the College. Some persons are asking for information on taking sign language classes. In addition, Deedra Blaylock, the student who was featured on the program, has received two fan letters from persons who watched the show.

THE MIKE DOUGLAS SHOW AND RITA COREY

Rita Corey is a senior at Gallaudet and a drama major. This semester she is studying at the National Theatre Institute in Waterford, Ct. She will return to Kendall Green for second semester.

Last Wednesday, Rita was in Philadelphia to appear on the "Mike Douglas Show." The program featured her as a promising young actress who is planning on a career in show business despite her hearing loss. The program, which is 90 minutes long, was taped last Wednesday, but will not be broadcast until Dec. 29th. Rita appears in the last 30 minutes of the program, a segment which is not seen in Washington, but which can be seen on the Baltimore channel which carries the program.

Donna Chitwood of the Alumni/Public Relations Office accompanied Rita to Philly.

PLAQUE RECEIVED

The National Trust for Historic Preservation has presented the College with a plaque to be placed on the base of the Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet and Alice statue which states that the statue itself has been loaned to the Trust for the coming year.

The bicentennial exhibition of the work of Daniel Chester French is still at the Metropolitan Museum in New York City. It will be shown here in Washington, beginning Feb. 11th, at the National Collection of Fine Arts.

EXHIBITS HERE AND ABROAD

Recently information about Gallaudet College was exhibited at the World Federation of the Deaf meeting in Rome and at the International Convention of Partners of the Americas in New Orleans. Both exhibits were arranged through the International Center on Deafness.

Representatives from more than 30 nations attended the Rome meetings and the New Orleans convention drew 460 registered participants from every nation in Central and South America and from 37 states of the U.S.
