CIS is designed to provide a quick and simple way of identifying visitors to campus in the evenings, on week-ends and during holiday periods. This will be in effect from 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. weekdays and 24 hours on week-ends and holidays. During these times all gates will be closed to campus except 8th Street.

UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND HOLDS SIGN CLASS

The University of Maryland Counseling Center sponsored a 2-day sign language class for interested staff members on January 5th and 6th. Mr. John Van Brunt, assistant director of the Center, arranged the class which was attended by 16 professional staff members. Among the participants were staff members from the University Health Center who are eager to learn more signs relevant to emergency medicine. At the present time there are approximately 20 hearing impaired students enrolled at the University.
