ENERGY CONSERVATION INFORMATION

If you have an electric water heater in your home and have a dishwasher, set the thermostat to 140°. If you have no dishwasher, 120° is sufficient for normal hot water use. That extra 20° rise in water temperature will cost you about 3/10 cents per gallon of hot water.

A hot water faucet dripping 60 drops a minute will waste 900 gallons of water a year. That's roughly 167 KWH of power costing around \$11.00 (4.1 gallons of oil or 557 cubic feet of gas). Remember you also have to pay for the water plus a sewer tax on the water that goes down the drain.
