Delegate Judy Toth has recently installed a TTY in her office in Annapolis to enable deaf citizens to communicate with their representatives in the Legislature. This TTY is the only one in the Maryland Legislature and is intended for use by all deaf Marylanders. They hope that the device will be used by deaf individuals throughout the state to ask questions concerning legislation, to clear up administrative problems with a state agency, to register viewpoints with Legislators and to ask for assistance.

The toll free number from the Washington Metropolitan area is 261-1211. Calls can be received from 9:00 - 5:00 each weekday.

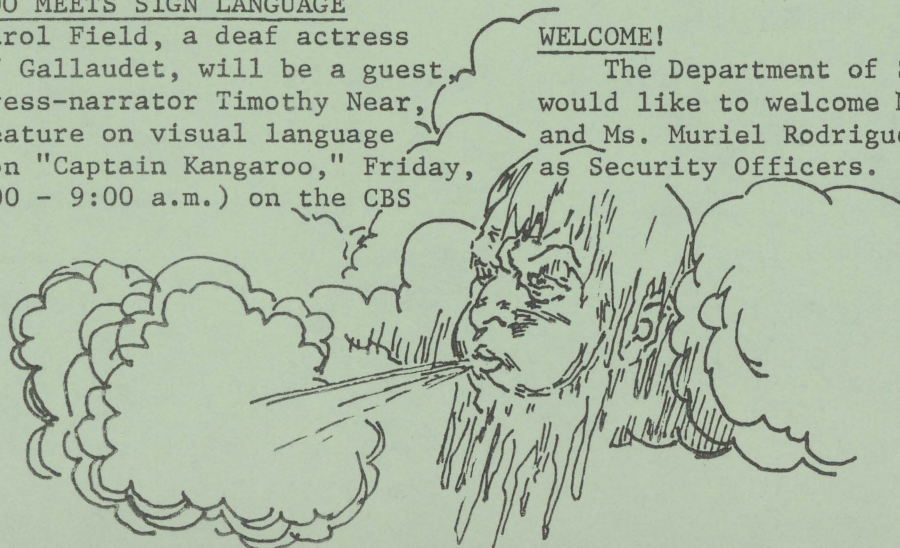
ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE IN INTERPRETING TO BE OFFERED
