ENERGY CONSERVATION FROM JIM HULL

"If you detect drafts around windows and doors, your home may need caulking and weatherstripping. Installing these materials is easy to do yourself, and a 10% savings in annual energy costs can be realized in the average house (with 12 windows and two doors).

"You'll save heating energy in your home if you keep your fireplace damper closed unless you have a fire going. An open damper in a 48 inch square fireplace can let up to 8% of your heat out the chimney."
