Deaf persons who are preparing their own tax return and have questions they would like answered straight from the horse's mouth can call IRS via TTY, Monday thru Friday, between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. The toll free number to call is 800-428-4732. One word of caution--if you call from a Gallaudet phone prefixed by 447, better have a hearing person initiate the call because an operator will ask where you are calling from. Otherwise, just dial the number and let your fingers do the talking.

BASKETBALL STRUGGLING ALONG
