ENERGY CONSERVATION TIPS

"If you own a house, consider placing a five foot high fence, or a row of 15 foot high evergreen trees, spaced ten feet apart on center, upwind of the corner of a house to protect it from winter winds. This action could result in a 30% reduction in infiltration of air and a 12% reduction in a heating bill can be realized. The windbreak should be approximately two times it's height away from the house. Reducing wind velocity from 15 to five mph will reduce air leakage of different types of windows from 70 to 80%."
