HISTORICAL BUILDINGS ON CAMPUS

Judy Bortner, Special Projects Manager, has been compiling information about our historical sites on campus. There are ten 19th Century buildings on Kendall Green representing one of our nation's most notable complexes of Victorian architecture. From time to time we will be sharing some facts about each of these buildings with you. In 1865 Edward Miner Gallaudet engaged Frederick Law Olmsted to prepare a master plan for the newly chartered institution. Olmsted and his partner, Calvert Vaux, played a very important role in the history of landscape design in our country. Among their many, now famous, projects were New York's Central Park, the grounds of the U.S. Capitol, Yosemite National Park, as well as a number of campus plans including Harvard, Yale and Stanford Universities. In coming issues of On The Green we will be discussing some interesting facts about our historical buildings.
