CONSTRUCTION INFO

The relocation of the utilities for the Learning Center will continue throughout May and June and probably into the second week of July. As soon as the utilities relocation in front of HMB is completed, excavation will begin on the section of roadway in the vicinity of Mary Thornberry and Washburn Fine Arts Buildings. This will be followed by excavation between Mary Thornberry and Peet Hall.

This part of the utilities relocation is expected to begin on or around the 24th of May and to take approximately two and one-half weeks. For part of this time, the road will have to be closed as will the north exit door from Peet Hall that faces the mall. Signs will be posted to let you know when this will happen. In addition, the playground between Mary Thornberry and Peet Hall will be demolished.
