MEMORIAL FUND TO BE ESTABLISHED

Mima Bravo, who passed away on May 19, 1978, received her Master's degree from Gallaudet College in 1977. Mima set the stage and put into action significant developments which now evidence the potential to make Costa Rica a model for Latin America in terms of services it provides deaf children, youth and adults.

The bridge which Mima built at great personal sacrifice and against seemingly insurmountable obstacles is a strong one. It remains for those who knew and loved her, who shared her single-minded hopes and dreams, who were humbled and inspired by the nobility and impact of her achievements, to strengthen the bridge and make it enduring. Her passing thus confronts us with a challenge: it is not an end but a new and important beginning.

The Mima Bravo Memorial Fund will be established to promote activities such as scholarship assistance to undergraduate or graduate students from Costa Rica to Gallaudet College; on-site and oncampus training programs for individuals from that nation; translated versions of newly developed curriculum materials; and to meet other needs that may arise.

DEAF LIKE ME

This new book written by Thomas Spradley and James Spradley is the story of a family's struggle to reach across the barriers of silence to break into their daughter's world. Their story spans the first five years of Lynn's life and shows the difficulties the parents went through in deciding how best to educate their daughter: the frustrating and confusing attempts to teach Lynn, who had never heard nor spoken, to lipread and speak; and later, realizing that their daughter might never speak, how they learned to communicate through sign language, her native language, and watched the world open up for her.

ENERGY TIPS FROM JIM HULL

"When you use air conditioning — set the thermostat at 78°, a reasonably comfortable and energy-efficient indoor temperature. The higher the setting and the less difference between indoor and outdoor temperature, the less outdoor hot air will flow into your room. If the 78° setting raises your home temperature 6°F, you could save between 12 and 47% in cooling costs, depending on where you live."
