completion of a needs assessment for the

Skinski administered a Behavioral Modi-
fication Workshop for house parents,
teachers and educational personnel at the
Washington School for the Deaf in Vancouver,
Washington.

--Della & Max Fitz-Gerald presented a one-
day workshop on June 17 entitled, "Sex
Education Workshop for Parents of Hearing
and Deaf Children," as part of Gallaudet's
Center for Continuing Education.

--Orin Cornett returned June 18 from two
weeks in Europe. He participated in a
workshop held by IBM France Scientific
Center, in Paris, June 5-7, assisting
them in planning a five-year project on
Automatic Cued Speech and speech training
aids. He was the only participant from
outside IBM, which brought together its
speech-processing experts from several
countries, including the United States.

While in Paris, Orin Cornett met with
parents and teachers who are using or
planning to use Cued Speech, teaching Cued
Speech in French to approximately 250
persons at the Institute des Jeunes Sourdes.
He then traveled to England and provided
presentations on Cued Speech for approx-
imately 340 people in Leeds, Bristol,
St. Albans and London.
