ENERGY CONSERVATION TIPS FROM JIM HULL

"If you are the chef and dishwasher in your household, consider these two energy saving suggestions.

"Try using glass or ceramic dishes for baking in the oven. You'll find that you can cook at temperature settings as much as 25° lower than are required for cooking similar meals in metal pans.

"Be sure your dishwasher is full, but not overloaded before you turn it on. An average dishwasher uses 14 gallons of hot water per load."

Training programs for a wide variety of volunteer jobs are scheduled for September and October. Candidates are carefully selected and competition is sometimes lively for many of these jobs.

Counselors will be trained for hot lines and crisis centers, for work with alcoholics, the mentally ill, child abusers, juvenile delinquents and run-a-ways, for foster home programs and work with retarded children. Counselors for birth control are also needed.
