SOCIAL WORK STUDENT RESPONDS TO INQUIRIES OF SOCIAL WORKERS IN LOCAL HOSPITALS WHO WANT TO BE MORE SENSITIVE TO THE NEEDS OF DEAF PATIENTS

Vivian Rai, a senior in the Gallaudet Social Work Program, met with the social work staff at Holy Cross Hospital in Silver Spring to discuss ways that they and other helping professionals could communicate better with deaf patients and their families. Vivian also described the isolation felt by deaf patients when they are given very little information about their condition or what to expect from treatment. On December 12 Vivian will provide a similar program for the nine social workers in the medical section of Georgetown University Hospital.
