"Help! You may not have noticed, but since the Tranian oil field strike, Energy Secretary James Schlesinger has been urging voluntary oil conservation efforts. The impact of the OPEC oil price hike is expected to contribute 6% to the inflation rate this year.

"A 10% reduction in energy consumption at Gallaudet is achievable without hardship on the student, staff or faculty. Do your part in achieving this goal by using energy wasely. Conservation is the result of all of us pulling in the same direction.

"Through November, two months into the fiscal year, our energy consumption is down 22% over the same period last year, much of it due to the warm fall. But winter has just begun - keep trying! We can make the 10% overall reduction for fiscal '79."
