ENERGY TIPS FROM JIM HULL (CONT.)

Here's how to save energy at home:

- 6. Keep the lint trap clean in clothes dryer. Operate the dryer with a full load.
- 7. If you have a fireplace, keep the chimney damper closed tightly when the fireplace is not in use.

8. Turn your thermostat down in the winter at night and up in the summer at night.

9. Never line your oven with foil as it interferes with proper heating.

10. Repair leaky faucets. A dripping faucet can waste 5000 gallons of water each year.

11. Keep shades and drapes closed during the day in rooms not being used during the summer. This will keep the sum's rays out.
