TRAVELWORLD, INC., COMES TO CAMPUS

The Office of Contracts and Operations Services announces that Travelworld, Inc., has been selected as the travel agent for Gallaudet College. Travelworld offers a comprehensive travel program for members of the Gallaudet community, including the following: lowest available rates for personal travel, commercial rate discounts for business travel, daily ticket/reservation deliveries to three central points on campus, emergency deliveries upon notice, remote (terminal) ticket pickups when necessary, lodging and ground transportation arrangements group and charter travel arrangements for business and pleasure and complete personal and vacation travel services.

Travelworld presently operates an information/reservation booth on the first floor of Cogswell Hall, Monday and Tuesday nights from 7:00 - 10:00 p.m. In the next month or so, an additional service booth will be installed in the Bookstore. This latter facility is tentatively scheduled to operate two to three days a week during regular Bookstore hours.

Both of these service facilities will employ Gallaudet students and/or professional travel agents, at least one of which will be well versed in sign language. In addition, TTY service will be available at each booth and at Travelworld's downtown reservations office. TTY numbers will be published as soon as the necessary installations are completed.

In the near future Travelworld will be hosting an "open house" to enable the students, staff and faculty of Gallaudet to become personally familiar with their operation. Be sure to watch for their invitation.
