REUNIONITES ARRIVE

The 30th Triennial GCAA Reunion got underway on Sunday, June 10, bringing approximately 300 people to Kendall Green. This year's reunion theme will be, "Gallaudet College and Deaf Leadership." The program will include tours, short courses, special learning experiences, an art exhibit, workshops, receptions and an opportunity for old friends to become reacquainted with each other and Gallaudet.

Guest speakers during the one week reunion activities will include the Honorable John Brademas, U.S. Representative from Indiana, Bernard Bragg, internationally known actor, and Louie Fant, Associate Professor, CSUN.

Reunion guests will be on campus from June 10 - 17. Get to know them, this is Gallaudet's true history.

GALLAUDET REPRESENTATIVES VISIT SPAIN

In March of this year Dr. Soler, Dr. Riekehof and Dr. Delgado visited Spain to discuss interpreter training, mainstreaming and exchange programs between the two countries. The invitation for the visit was made by PROAS (Patronage for the Promotion and Assistance to the Deaf), an organization that plans, coordinates and subsidizes many activities and service programs addressed to the needs of the deaf population and parents and teachers of deaf children in Spain.

Gallaudet's expert representatives presented papers translated into Spanish, made presentations to various groups of parents, teachers and directors of schools

for the deaf and appeared on a three-minute interview program on Spanish television. All of the papers read will be published by PROAS. Because of this, the messages carried by Dr. Riekehof, Dr. Soler and Dr. Delgado have become widely known in Spain.

CULTURAL ARTS CENTER OPENS

This fall marks the opening of Prince George's County's first cultural arts center, the Montpelier Barn, located in Laurel, Maryland.

The Barn houses three unique galleries, as well as studio space for rent by local painters, printmakers, sculptors and craftspeople. In addition, the Barn is part of the Montpelier Complex - an historical mansion with a carriage house, gazebo and gardens.

Any artist who is interested in renting studio space or in exhibiting in the Barn should contact Margery Freeman at 277-2200, extension 396, for further information and a registration form.

All artists will be selected by jury. Registration for the jurying will take place between June 1 and July 1. There will be a \$5.00 registration fee for each artist.
