MORE ON CAPTIONING

A videotape of the FCC's April 1979 meeting on captioning for the hearing impaired will be shown this August 29, in room 856, 1919 M Street, N.W.

The four-hour videotape includes a briefing on plans for closed captioning of TV programs and a panel discussion among representatives of the broadcast industry, the Public Broadcasting Service and the Federal Government. These videotapes contain closed captioning and sign language inserts for the benefit of the hearing impaired.
