# VERNON NAMED TO DOCTOR CHAIR

Noted research psychologist, Dr. McCay Vernon, has accepted the Powrie Vaux Doctor Chair of Deaf Studies for the academic year 1979-80.

With more than 200 journal articles, books and book chapters to his credit, Vernon is a recognized and respected leader in such areas of research as the sociological and psychological aspects of deafness; rehabilitation, counseling and education of deaf individuals; language and intelligence; and the causes of deafness. Vernon is a professor of psychology at Western Maryland College, which has a program devoted to preparing both graduate and undergraduate students for careers in the education of the deaf.

Appointments to the Powrie Vaux Doctor Chair are reserved for resident teacherscholars who have made significant contributions to the field of deaf education or who show promise of significant contributions. Vernon, who easily meets the requirements for the Chair, will spend his time at Gallaudet completing a book on the psychology of hearing loss and engaging in research in four general areas.

First, he is concerned with the nature of Usher's Syndrome, a genetic condition involving hearing loss and gradual progressive blindness caused by retinitis pigmentosa. He hopes to work on establishing the hearing dimension of Usher's Syndrome. In addition, he plans to initiate research on a new system for evaluating the work of vocational rehabilitation counselors. Finally, he is interested in the development of a nonverbal personality test for deaf persons and others with language problems. MORE ON SUB/ELY RELOCATION
