1979 FESTIVAL OF AMERICAN FOLKLIFE

A Caribbean carnival and parade on the Mall, a medicine man selling patent medicines, a local craftsman demonstrating stone carving, and Vietnamese-Americans preparing their favorite foods will all be featured at the 1979 Festival of American Folklife. The 13th Annual Festival, sponsored by the Smithsonian Institution and the National Park Service, is scheduled for Wednesday, October 3, through Monday, October 8 and will be accessible to deaf persons. Interpreters will be provided during seven days of Festival and Festival-related events.

FESTIVAL (CONT.)

An interpreter will be stationed at a different area of the Festival every day with the exception of Sunday, October 7, when Festival events are cancelled on the occasion of the Pontifical mass on the Mall. The festival will take place on the Washington Monument grounds. It is open daily from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

DIMENSION 2000 FRUSTRATIONS ANSWERED

The old Gallaudet telephone numbers are part of the Federal Government system. The General Services Administration (GSA) is responsible for the overall administration of this system, including referrals of calls from old to new numbers. The GSA utilizes computerized referral of disconnected lines to the main GSA operator at 655-4000. At this number, a GSA operator will ask for the number being dialed and will give the correct new listing. Because the GSA computers and operators do not have access to TTY machines they are unable to provide TTY recordings for new listings.

Because of limited space for answering machines and the technical necessity to disconnect and remove the old numbers prior to connecting the new listings, the College was able to retain only the two main numbers (447-0314 & 315). These two numbers are presently connected to answering machines in the A/PR Office and give both a voice and TTY message, advising the caller to dial the new main number 651-5000.

Prior to the cutover, a memo was hand-carried to each department on campus listing the department numbers along with change of number notification cards which could be mailed to frequent callers. In addition, the A/PR office mailed lists of new numbers to many deaf organizations throughout the country.

The C & P staff and Bob Quarles are presently visiting each department and area on campus to write orders to bring telephone designs into agreement with actual requirements as well as to report and correct any problems.
